

English Abstract

From Schools of Death to School of Life:

In this article, I would like to discuss the metaphorical term "school of life" and the lines of criticism it raises regarding the institutional school. The purpose of the article is to present the story of Janusz Korczak, "The School of Life" as a literary and pedagogic interpretation of two later Israeli texts: "I Remember a Question" by Yehuda Amichai and "Ofek" by Benjamin Tammuz. The analysis proposed for each of these texts will focus on the emerging dialogue between the School of Death and the School of Life in view of the intersection between these schools. In this sense, Korczak's actuality is revealed again and emphasizes his uniqueness as an author, as an intellectual and especially as an educator.
